
Treasurer Roy Hammer highlighted the contributions made by the Friends to Sturgis Library during the year (see list) with special attention given to our most recent funding projects:

- \$1,500 for Children's Services which includes Sturgis participation in a townwide summer reading program and a new BRIO train set for the Children's Room.
- \$1,500 for the purchase of archival material, such as the Sandy Neck Lighthouse Keepers Log (1840s—1880s) and signed James Otis documents.

In 2007-2008 the Friends donated over \$12,000 to the Library. Our funds come primarily from Bookstore sales, annual membership dues and special events. Two such events will occur in June and July. Our Annual Book, Plant and Bake sale will be held on Friday June 6th and Saturday, June 7th and on Sunday, July 13th (12-4 pm) the Friends will sponsor a tour of 6 gardens in Barnstable Village and Cummaquid.

Our fiscal year runs from July 1-June 30 so it is once again time to invite you to join the Friends. Annual membership is \$15.00 per household from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. # BENEFIT FROM YOUR GENEROSITY

In the last edition of the *Sturgis Library News* the Board of Trustees announced the establishment of a formal planned giving program with a generous gift of an annuity from Trustee Jim Hinkle. In response to questions about this program I would like to share with you how a Sturgis Charitable Gift Annuity works.

In exchange for a charitable gift of \$10,000 or more in cash, saving bonds or stock, a Sturgis Charitable Gift Annuity is established for you. The annuity contract specifies the income you will receive annually or quarterly for the rest of your life, no matter what happens to interest rates or other financial markets. The annuity generates a charitable income tax deduction, part of the income received is tax free, and the rate of return is often higher than what is available from many conservative or fixed income investments.

# From the Director's Desk



I have been very fortunate to be one of 15 candidates from area nonprofit organizations accepted to participate in the first Cape and Islands Nonprofit Leadership Development Program, sponsored by the Cape Cod Foundation and the held at the Gestalt International Study Center (GISC). The nine-month program requires a significant commitment from the participating leaders and their organizations, and covers all facets of leadership in the nonprofit setting, from fundraising and marketing to building more effective relationships with Board members, staff and the community. The program is designed and conducted by GISC,

and has received substantial funding from the Peter and Elizabeth Tower Foundation. The program began in January, and will culminate with the completion of a comprehensive project in October of 2008.

Gestalt International Study Center is a nonprofit organization dedicated to studying and teaching the interpersonal skills that lead to action, change and growth. 
#### **STAFF NEWS**

To access these materials you will need a CLAMS card issued from a participating library (Sturgis is one). You will download and save free software onto your computer. At that point, you can check an item out online and listen to or read it on the device of your choice. To get started, go to the CLAMS site: www.clamsnet.org and click on the download link. Please let the circulation staff know if you have any questions.

She had a wonderful outlook – always positive – and if a shred of humor existed in a situation, she found it and shared it.

## SPECIAL COLLECTIONS TO SEE THE LIGHT OF DAY New Research and Collections Space Coming Soon



The Friends of Sturgis Library celebrated the grand opening of their attractive new **Book Shop** on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, and they've stocked the shelves with selections of new and antiquarian books, videos, music CDs, children's items, and gift items. The Book Shop, now located near the main entrance of the library, is staffed by volunteers three days a week, and items are available for purchase whenever the library is open.

Relocating the Friends Book Shop allowed us to provide more visibility for the Shop while also providing increased research and collections space in the historic portion of our building.

The Lothrop Room, previous home to the Book Shop, will soon be transformed into a room for research, reading, and display. Here are some of the highlights of the new space:

• Glassed-in shelves will hold ever-changing displays of materials from our special collections and archives.

- Collections currently stored in the basement will be available for browsing and research, including genealogical periodicals, maritime and local history titles, yearbooks, and more.
- Comfortable seating and workspace for researchers and quiet study will be available.

We hope to have the transformation complete by the end of June, 2008.
