Scope and Content Note: The collection contains a ledger with records of the Barnstable Comedy Club from 1935 to 1955. It is an interesting accounting, and includes the names of members, dues paid, bills paid, rent collected, expenditures for supplies, tickets sales, names of plays produced, and more.

Historical and Biographical Information:

The Barnstable Comedy Club, which was established around 1922, often used the Village Hall (built in 1912 and run by the Women's Club) to rehearse and stage their productions. Because the Hall was frequently used by other area groups, the BCC often held rehearsals at the Old Barnstable Inn. The BCC did not take over ownership of the Village Hall until the 1960s.
